## Prevention of gender based violence

- Communities Care Model for social norms change at community level
- Support to government's lead initiative on Violence Against Children
- Empowerment Self Defense and Boys Bystander Interventions

## Provision of life saving services

- Women and Girls Friendly Spaces
- One Stop Centers
- Clinical Management of rape with the health sector

## Gender based violence risk mitigation

- GBV risk mitigation into WASH programming in protected sites
- Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM) to include safety audits in the general guidance tools
- GBV integration into nutrition and young child feeding centers in refugee camps
- Social work curriculum developed with Universities



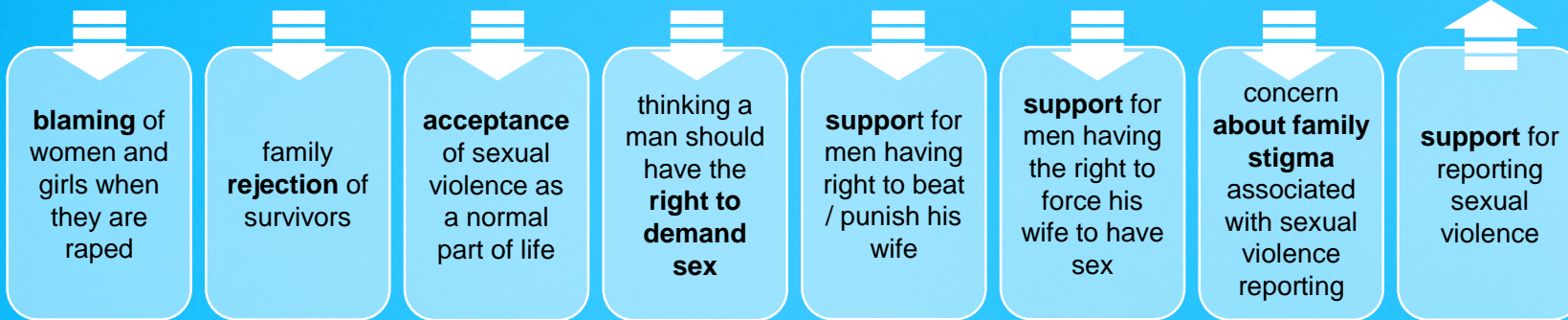
# The Communities Care Approach

The evaluation showed positive changes in social norms and confidence in service providers in the district that participated in the Communities Care programme.

## HARMFUL SOCIAL NORMS CHANGED

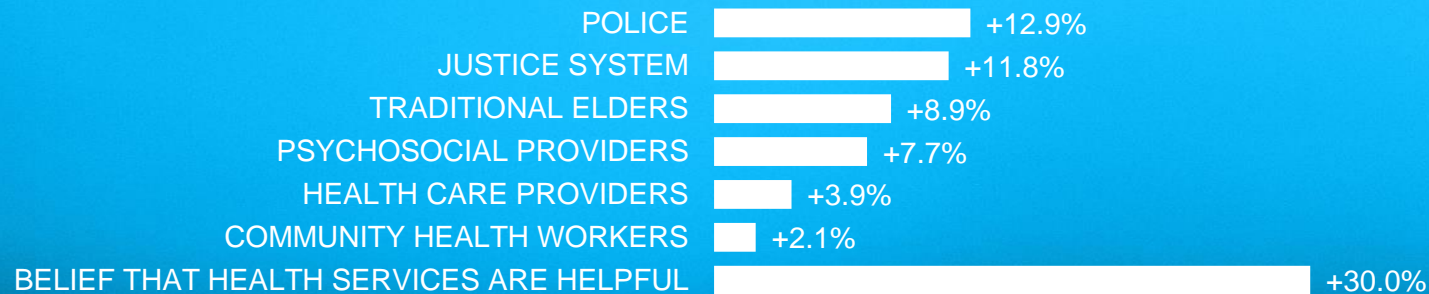
Participants in the intervention district showed statistically significant improvements in GBV associated norms versus in the control district:
